Project Narrative Concerning our Bookends Program:

Overview:

Bookends (Building On Our Kindergarten Experience with New Daily Skills) is a program UW provides in the schools during the school day. Children are identified by the kindergarten teachers (up to 20) who need the most one on one help.

Retired kindergarten teachers (when available) are paid for by UW Bookends at the rate of \$37.50 an hour through United Way payroll to work with students once or twice each week for 9 weeks. Numeracy or literacy skills are identified as the needs. Principals will identify teachers for Bookends.

United Way Staff tries to meet with all the new teachers prior to them starting so they understand the importance of teaching the kids about the homework boxes and books.

Pre-assessments on letter recognition, letter sounds, sight words – post assessment at the end of the program of the same.

Children are given "homework boxes" that are put together and funded completely by the United Way and its community partners.

- Homework Boxes Defined
 - Pencil boxes containing items a child will need at home to complete homework including:
 - Two pencils
 - Pencil grip
 - Scissors
 - Triangle crayons
 - Small play-doh container
 - Markers
 - Children are also given 1 NEW BOOK each week of the program

Once some students are identified that could use the intervention services, a letter outlining the program will be sent to parents of potential participants. The letter will be from United Way and the individual school and teachers.

To prove and measure efficacy, most schools give aggregate NWEA or iReady scores for all kindergarten students and then with Bookends students separately. This will give us data to use for development and improvements to the program as well as proof of concept data for coming years efforts.

Community Needs Addressed:

The Wells County Community Foundation has identified four critical areas of need. The main area that this program addresses is the critical need for further support concerning Early Childhood Education. We directly address this need with organizing, facilitating, providing materials, and providing salaries for the elementary schools' recruited teachers that provide educational interventions. The students identified as those struggling to keep up or catch up with the standard educational goals and expectations are then addressed in an engaging, fun, and personal level. With the help of the principals of all four area elementary school as well as the teachers they recruit, we get to make a significant impact for these little ones together in a familiar environment that costs nothing to the family. This is significant as statistically more than 10% of children live in homes in Wells County that the household income is to be considered to be below the poverty line. A significant amount of the students that receive these services might not be able to afford these services without the current offerings of this program.

Timeline:

Projected start dates range from September of the school year through the end of the year-depending on the availability of the funding as well as the availability of the teachers to be appointed as well as their availability to assist the children.

Expected Results:

We expect measurable growth during their 9-18 sessions in group and one-on-one tutoring. In the past, we have seen a significant increase in test scores. The students will become more confident and more capable in and outside of the classroom. The student is also afforded further positive reinforcement with the educational process as well as the teachers in their lives that build relationships that often last far beyond just their time in the Bookends Program. Long term expecations are a student that may have either stayed behind or fallen behind the average academic standard would receive the interventions that either catches the student up to be more in line with their peers or to be able to maintain a level of academic excellence that can potentially support a brighter future than a life that may not have had this intervention offered.

Partnership:

Every elementary school in Wells County and the school system as a whole is considered a partner. Julie Meitzler, Assistant Superintendant of BHS MSD, has agreed to not only continue to endorse this as a partner of the program but also answer any questions and give feedback to the efficacy of the program, it's teachers, and the results. Additionally, all teachers and building principals are such an intregal part of Bookends and the success of the program that we would encourage the committee to reach out for further information and feedback.

Potential Budget:

Below, you will find the maximum cost that United Way of Wells County could incur. We have raised some money through a matching grant with Indiana United Ways in partnership with the Lilly Endowment. That gets our organization to about 75% of the minimum costs (around \$12,000 minimum) for this year with a potential of only providing a total of around 33% of the maximum costs of almost \$25,000.
